With this goal as a starting point, the Fulbright Program has provided more than 230,000 participants - chosen for their leadership potential with the opportunity to observe each others' political, economic and cultural institutions, exchange ideas, and embark on joint ventures of importance to the general welfare of the world's inhabitants. In some countries Fulbright provides only partial scholarships. Application process usually begins 18 months prior enrollment.
